Watch the *Slip! Slop! Slap! Seek! Slide!* clip to familiarise yourselves with SunSmart's key messages.

SunSmart would like to use board games to educate primary students about the importance of these sun protection messages, and need your help!

In small groups, design a board game which educates children about the importance of sun protection and the various ways to protect their skin from skin cancer.

Keep in mind that your game must include the following:

- Strategies to be SunSmart – Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek, Slide.
- Information about UV and the UV Index.
- When sun protection is required.
- Information about sunscreen – SPF, how much needs to be applied, and how often.
- The short-term and long-term risks of not using sun protection.
- Your own SunSmart mascot who will appeal to young children.



Extend yourself

Once the class has finished, swap games between the groups. Using the assessment rubric below, review the other group's board game, including how effective you feel the game is at educating children about sun protection.

At the conclusion of the project, students may wish to laminate their game and donate to the local primary school.
